Buckets of Hope

The North American Mission Board, Baptist Global Response, and state convention Disaster Relief directors are asking families of CSBC churches to purchase white, five-gallon buckets and pack them with required foodstuffs for \$30 each. The food in a single bucket can feed a Haitian

family for a week. Baptists also are asked to include a \$10 check (made payable to CSBC) placed in an envelope and attached to the bucket's lid to help with the costs of shipping the buckets directly to Haiti. In this bulletin a detailed instruction sheet about what to buy and how to pack the bucket has been developed for use by those wishing to participate.
