International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church Prayer Focus:

Saving Christians from Islamic State in the Middle East

Christians are one of the primary civilian targets of the Islamic State terror group, which has threatened to eradicate minorities from within the territories it controls and beyond, even as the Christian population in the Middle East has been on a steep decline. Most recently, Islamic State, which is also known as ISIS or ISIL, vowed to slaughter Christian Arabs in Jerusalem, saying its militants will "clean this country and the Muslim Quarter from these Christians during this holy Ramadan." Although the Sunni terror group doesn't have a known official branch in Israel, the threat issued points to its agenda, ambition and targets. In June, ISIS kidnapped 88 Eritrean Christians in Libya. In May, ISIS captured Ethiopian Christians and executed them, three months after it beheaded 21 Egyptian Copts. Christians in the Middle East accounted for about 20 percent at the start of the 20th century, and their number has reduced to about 5 percent. And many of those who remain are now facing the jihadists' "convert-or-die" policy, especially in Iraq and Syria... Christians in the region have expectations from the international Christian community. As Chaldean Catholic Patriarch Louis Sako of Baghdad recently said, "We feel forgotten and isolated. We sometimes wonder, if they kill us all, what would be the reaction of Christians in the West? Would they do something then?" Let's hope, pray and make our best efforts so that Christians in the Middle East would not feel forgotten in their most difficult time.
