I. Our Greatest Desire Should Be Christ!

(John 3: 22-30)

22 After this, Jesus and His disciples went to the Judean countryside, where He spent time with them and baptized.

23 John also was baptizing in Aenon near Salim, because there was plenty of water there. People were coming and being baptized,

24 since John had not yet been thrown into prison.

25 Then a dispute arose between John's disciples and a Jew about purification.

26 So they came to John and told him, "Rabbi, the One you testified about, and who was with you across the Jordan, is baptizing—and everyone is flocking to Him."

27 John responded, "No one can receive a single thing unless it's given to him from heaven.

28 You yourselves can testify that I said, 'I am not the Messiah, but I've been sent ahead of Him.'

29 He who has the bride is the groom. But the groom's friend, who stands by and listens for him, rejoices greatly at the groom's voice. So this joy of mine is complete.

30 He must increase, but I must decrease."

John's Heart Desire: I Must Decrease, He Must Increase

II. To Decrease is to Increase in Christ!

(Matthew 4: 18-22)

18 As He was walking along the Sea of Galilee, He saw two brothers, Simon, who was called Peter, and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the sea, since they were fishermen.

19 "Follow Me," He told them, "and I will make you fish for people!"

20 Immediately they left their nets and followed Him.

21 Going on from there, He saw two other brothers, James the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They were in a boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets, and He called them.

22 Immediately they left the boat and their father and followed Him.

Left - Forsook, Omitted, Laid Aside Their Lives and...

Immediately - At Once, Straightaway

Followed - To Be in the Same Way With, Accompany as a Disciple

Fishers of Men = A New Heart

(Ezekiel 36:26)

I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you; I will remove your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh.

Seek First

(Romans 13:12)

Night Spent - Day at Hand

(Ephesians 5: 15-17)

15 Pay careful attention, then, to how you walk—not as unwise
people but as wise—

16 making the most of the time, because the days are evil.

17 So don't be foolish, but understand what the Lord's will is.

Walk Circumspectly

*(careful to consider all circumstances and possible
consequences : prudent)*
